Will of Peter Storm Aug 19, 1839

In the name of God Amen. I Peter Storm of Twin Township, Ross County, State of Ohio, German, being of sound mind, memory and understanding--considering the uncertainty of this life think fit to make this my last will and testament in the following manner to wit--I recommend my soul to the hands of God and my body to the earth whence it were taken and touching my worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life I give hence and dispose of the same in the following manner--

I give and bequeath to Barbary my dearly beloved wife the third of the place I now live on and the third of the moveables for her own use during her life and after her death the whole place shall fall to my son Jacob Storm. Immediately after my demise my son Jacob shall have the whole place excepting his mother's third. Besides the place he shall have the wagon and two sets of gears then the two other parts of the moveables shall be equally divided amongst the five other boys, George, John, Peter, David and Joseph. My son Samuel being pounded for charging George with twenty-five dollars, John with seventy-five dollars, Peter with seventy dollars and Daniel with thirty-five dollars and Joseph forty dollars which he received of me toward part of their legacy. They shall each of them have that much less in the division of the four girls Susannah, Polly, Elizabeth and Rebecca. After their mother's death shall have their mother's 1/3 of furniture equally divided among them.

I do hereby approve my friends Frederic Pengeh and Alexder Gillfellow executors of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all others in testimony. Hereby I have signed my name Peter Storm.
